## **P.E**

Elementary Physical Education at Crosshill is designed to help our students learn and grow physically, emotionally, socially, and spiritually. This is achieved through hard work and fun. In PE students will learn to better control the bodies God gave them through games, sports, and healthy competition, all with the hope of instilling a love for movement and physical activity that encourages students to make healthy choices throughout life.

## **Music**

At Crosshill Christian, our music curriculum is designed to spark a lifelong love of music while building students' skills, confidence, and joy in using their gifts for God's glory. First graders dive into a lively, hands-on Drum Unit, while 2nd and 3rd graders learn to play the recorder in the Recorder Unit and prepare for a special performance. In 4th–6th grades, students explore the ukulele in the Ukulele Unit, culminating in a performance that showcases their growth and creativity. Throughout the year, all grades engage in enriching units such as Why Music Matters, Note Names and Rhythms, Instrument Names and Families, and Music Through Movement. Students also enjoy seasonal and special projects including our Christmas Performance Unit, Composer/Genre/Instrument Research, Music March Madness Genres, and the Spring Concert Unit. These experiences not only deepen musical knowledge but also nurture teamwork, discipline, and a heart for worship through music.

## **Band**

The purpose of our Elementary Band is not only to cultivate musical skills and creativity, but also to glorify God through music. This program is designed to introduce students in 4th-6th grades to the fundamentals of instrumental music. Students will learn the basics of reading music, proper technique for their chosen instrument, and ensemble performance skills. By developing their talents and learning to work together in harmony, students are encouraged to use their gifts in service to others and as an expression of worship.
